The waste transfer stations are needed to transfer recycling and waste to processing and disposal plants outside the Borough.

We also empty around 13 million bins every year - 13 million!

The Council has also invested 1 million pounds into constructing a state-of-the-art airtreatment

system which ensures that the impact of odour from the site is kept to a minimum.

So our crews go out, they collect the waste through the refuse vehicles that collect the wheelie bins.

It returns to site, it goes through a process of weighing

The building is quite sophisticated, although it is just a simple box. It accepts the waste by tipping and we bulk it.

It's then put through a shredding process and it's then collected by larger vehicles which take it away to an energy from waste.

We have automatic doors on the building which prevents the door staying open too long. The building is kept under negative pressure, which means it's constantly sucking air into the building that air is then put through a carbon filter which takes any impurities out of the air which might create an odour.

We will continue to reduce black bin waste. You can put newspapers, magazines, paper, cardboard, glass bottles and jars, flexible plastic bottles, juice and milk cartons,

Remember to always 'Leave it Loose' as recycled products are much easier to process when the not in boxes and bags

They need to go into the shops box you received and return to yourlocal pharmacy or NHS trust.

Finally at number one. We have our old friend clothing and textiles.consider recycling these items and bring them to a local charity shop or even make something else out of them. You can also bring them too many supermarkets that have clothing bank collection points in their car parks other items that cannot go in your recycling bin are nappies polystyrene hard plastics.
