	Trade waste contract terms are being increased from 3 months to 12 months	
	In Q1&2 of 2022/23 HPBC had a 99.97% success rate for waste collections. Domestic containers delivered within 10 days were at 79.11% compared to a target of 100% - this was due to a high rate of sickness due to seasonal flu, and deliveries have since become up to date. Missed bins were at 37.25 per 100,000 compared to a target of 36 due to similar reasons.  In Q1&2 of 2021/22 SMDC had a 99.97% success rate for its waste collections – targets for delivery of domestic containers and missed bins rate were achieved.  KPIs for Street Cleansing, Grounds & Parks are on track – the teams are currently focusing on the Spring Clean and cleansing of rural main roads, as well as working through the grass cutting schedule.	
5.	Operational Update This agenda item was covered by the previous item. No additional comments were made.	
6.	Waste and Strategy Update  JT advised Derbyshire County Council have had a meeting with DEFRA and invited representatives from the districts. This did not provide any new information the board were not already aware of. JT advised it is time for AES to consider what the rounds may look like and what the methodology will be – an options paper will be developed for consideration, likely with the help of external consultants.
