	There will be further consultation on the formula for funding
7.	HR Paper on Pay and Allowances
	MH proposed that AES will reimburse an employee for payment of one
	professional membership per year, in circumstances where the Company requires, or
	would prefer that postholder to hold such membership. As part of the TUPE transfer from
	the Alliance Councils to AES, some employees already have the right to be reimbursed in
	this way and reimbursement of membership of such professional bodies is commonplace within private industry.
	It is proposed that we extend this right to reimbursement to new employees, and it is
	believed that doing so will help AES to attract and retain people with the right skills.
	Board Resolution – The board moved to approve the Policy on Professional Subscriptions.
