1.	Cllr Arthur Moran chaired the meeting throughout	
	AM reported that due notice of the meeting had been given and that a quorum was present. Accordingly, he declared the meeting open.	
2.	Declaration of Conflict of Interest No conflicts of interest were declared

3.	Minutes of meeting held on 27th June 2022 and Matters arising	
	The minutes were agreed as an accurate record of the meeting.	
4.	Operational Update (Verbal)	
	The extreme weather conditions this month have been the most difficult challenge since	
	the last meeting. With agreement of the Councils, services were brought in early on Tuesday 19 th July due to high temperatures, with the commitment to complete the rounds	
	by the end of the week. JT gave her thanks to the Councils for their support in this. There	
	are still high levels of organic waste as expected for this time of year. Street Cleansing and Grounds Maintenance continue to move forward as usual.	
	Cromer Road Transfer Station in Stoke will be available to us from the beginning of August.	
	We will be able to send Organic waste that historically went to the Adderley Green	
	transfer station. There is also the possibility to use this site as contingency for our recyclate.	
5.	Waste and Resource Strategy Update (Verbal)	
	Feedback from DEFRA was expected before the MPs broke for Summer but has not yet	
	been published. George Eustace, Environment Secretary was speaking at the food and	
	drink federation a week ago and said that DEFRA is willing to take longer on implementing	

	the extended producer responsibility reforms. He feels this and the deposit return scheme are the right way to go but is not wanting to rush into legislation only to see it unravel at a later date. It is not likely we will receive any further information on this until September at the earliest. MT noted there may be a new government which delay the process further – JT agreed this was a possibility.
6.	Any Other Business MH advised that the team are continuing to consult on the restructure, and it is going well so far. It is due to end at the end of August. The only thing to still be considered at the end of the consultation is the request to standardise the 40hr working week.
